Goodbye Andrew Jackson. Hello, Harriet Tubman. And hello Settled Minister too. Today we kick off a brief fund-raising effort to fill a one-time special need: supporting the work of our newly-elected Ministerial Search Committee, especially the travel costs of potential ministers and the relocation costs of the one called. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 between now and the end of June. (The UUA recommends more than twice this, but our frugal-minded Board knows it can manage for less.)

How will we raise this money? We will do it together, by celebrating the U.S. Treasury Department's announcement that former slave Harriet Tubman will soon replace slave-owning Andrew Jackson on the \$20 bill. Together, we will retire five hundred (yes 500) Andrew Jackson \$20 bills. Because $500 \times \$20 = \$10,000!$ So consider setting aside a twenty or maybe two this week to help support our search for a settled minister. Stay tuned for details on how you can help.

Eyewitness Gaza: Keeping Hope Alive A Talk by Dr. Nancy Murray, Co-Founder, The Gaza Mental Health Foundation Inc. Friday, May 20, 2016. HUUC Fellowship Building. Doors open at 7:00, talk starts at 7:30. Dr. Murray recently returned from the Gaza Strip, which the UN has said will be "unlivable" within four years. She will describe the conditions she encountered this past April and how people under siege are seeking to rebuild their lives. . What responsibility do Americans share for what is happening to the people of Gaza? And what can we do to help keep people safe and keep hope alive?
